



"What Is the Gospel?"

All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation (2 Cor. 5:18). In Christ, education must also be reconciled to God. All who in Christ are reconciled to God and walk in His Spirit find their endeavors reconciled to God as they express the righteousness of Christ. This includes our education endeavors. This month we emphasize the need to see education reformed in Christ. Opportunities to fellowship around the Word through conferences in Zambia and Swaziland called the brethren to hear the call to mission through Christ's redemptive mandate and to love Christ in all of life. Thank you for rejoicing with us in the labor God has ordained for us as we share His faithfulness and bring needs before you so that we can fellowship together in prayer for the work of Christ through ACU.

The Erosion of Education by Dr. Ken Turnbull

As expressed in Romans 1:18-23, there is a decay towards foolishness that has established the path of our secular education system in eliminating God from knowledge. This attempt to eliminate God from knowledge has been noted by philosophers as an alienation of fact from value.¹ This leads to three extremes.² (i) When the human mind is exalted as autonomous, as opposed to being subjective and dependent upon its Creator, man is deified and knowledge becomes existential or only concerned with human existence as though it can be separated from God. (ii) Eliminating God from knowledge leads to irreconcilable deficiencies in defining morals or values. This leads to an attempt to establish some absolute or abstract law, some standard outside of the God who holds all things together in His perfect justice and love. This results in deifying abstract law leading knowledge into idealism. (iii) When attempt is made to balance existentialism and idealism with a view towards nature - not nature as God's creation, but some mysteriously derived, self-existing reality - then nature is deified

Matters of Praise

Thank God for His ever-present hand in moving the vision toward fruition day-by-day.

Continue to offer praise to God for those He is calling to assist

as the world is viewed in empirical isolation, disconnecting what one observes with the senses from reason. This derives some form of self-existing "brute facts" with no moral or value relevance. All three of these extremes are in constant tension without balance as they don't equate with the reality in which we exist. They are the secular attempt at separating God from our reality and result in a very non-holistic approach to knowledge. As the world has always known, "In him we live and move and have our being (Acts 17:28)." The secular denial of this has plunged our education system into foolishness in trying to remove God from our pursuit of knowledge. As God is the source of all things, so true knowledge can't be attained outside of Him. "For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together (Colossians 1:16-17)." Education must return to reality where knowledge exists only in the context of the God who creates and defines reality. This would be a first step towards holistic education where knowledge is of God.

Our dear brother Voddie Baucham (Grace Family Baptist Church, Spring TX) made his annual trek to Zambia to join 4 prominent Zambian pastors (Kabwe Kabwe, Ronald Kalifungwa, Conrad Mbewe and Choolwe Mwetwa) in support of the 23rd Reformed Family Conference which drew over 1,200 delegates from at least 7 African countries, 3 European countries, the USA, Australia and the United Arab Emirates. The theme was "Missions: Not Beyond Our Reach." It was truly a Christ-exalting experience to hear the beckoning call that it is time for

Africa to become a sending continent coming from this 20 year young, church-growing movement in Zambia. While the still-growing, church-planting movement has produced over 40 churches in all of the major urban areas across the country, the week's trumpet sounded to call missionaries to labor in the ripened fields beyond the borders, into the 10/40 window and other global places of need. The need was crystal clear for gospel-focused roots flourishing in the hearts of God's people, bearing fruit in the families and the churches, and finally moving God's people to deny themselves, take up their crosses with expectations of hardship, suffering and persecution, and to go for the sake of proclaiming the only thing that brings meaning to this life: the gospel message of reconciliation to our Creator through regeneration in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The week was a truly inspiring

journey in the work. We still need many like-minded servants of Christ to labor with us in construction, academics and as student labor disciplers, and we are grateful for the continuing encouragement of those who God impacts with a desire to help in the work.

We thank God for the initiation of what we pray will be a fruitful relationship between ACU and MTW (Mission to the World) for the furtherance of theological and Christ-centered education in Africa. The partnership is moving forward - we pray, to the Father's glory.

We praise God for gifting those who are partnering with us through giving. May He continue to supply them abundantly as they contribute to His kingdom work that is springing forth from Zambia.

The Sola 5 Conference Sep 6-9, 2012, Mbabane, Swaziland



Sola 5 is an association of God-centered evangelicals in southern Africa currently with member churches in Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. The five solas of the Reformation include: "Tota et Sola Scriptura" (All of Scripture and only the Scriptures), "Sola Gratia" (Grace alone), "Solus Christus" (Christ alone), "Sola Fide" (Faith alone) and "Soli Deo Gloria" (The glory of God alone). These are the unifying commitments of the Sola 5 Association. The theme of the conference was "Loving Christ in All of Life." The fellowship had a refreshing pastoral tone with a mission emphasis that was inspiring. Dr. Ken and Lisa Turnbull were able to attend along with others representing Zambia. Ken was given opportunity to remind the association of the gospel-centered, worldview-transforming goal of ACU and to update the fellowship on ACU's progress.
